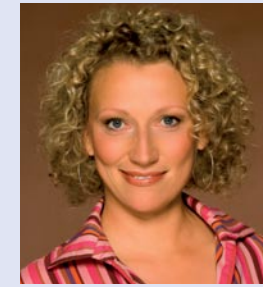
Alumni
